In-person Worship

After much discussion among Elders and Staff, it was decided to proceed with a "trial" in-person worship service on Sunday, Dec. 6 at 9:30 a.m. The online worship will still be shown at that time.

The in-person service will be different than usual. First of all, the number who may attend is limited, so there is a registration form available on the church website, or you may call the Church Office to sign up. In order to remain safe and healthy, everyone will be required to wear masks the entire time and will be seated in assigned places that are socially-distanced, there will be no congregational singing and no socializing before or after the service. If you are not comfortable attending in person, you are encouraged to watch from home.

End of Year Contribution Guidelines

As you begin year-end tax planning for your family or business, don't forget that donations to Longview Community Church qualify as a tax deductible charitable contribution. All cash or other asset contributions for 2020 must be received in the Church Office by 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, December 31, 2020 or post-marked no later than December 31, 2020. In addition, all online gifts must have an "approved" status by December 31, 2020 in order to receive contribution credit for 2020. Any gift received or post-marked on or after January 1, 2021 will be credited to 2021. Also, please remember to notify the Church Office if you had an address change this year.
