Pastor's Perspective

All I really need to know...

I am sure many of you have heard the familiar Robert Fulghum credo, "All I really need to know I learned in Kindergarten". This credo eventually turned into a book of essays which has sold over 7 million copies. It is with this credo in mind that we will head into the LvCC Summer Sermon Series, "All I really need to know I learned in Sunday School". This summer we are going back to our Sunday School days. We will look at familiar stories told to us as kids which many of us have shared with our own kids, and grandkids. Stories like...

Creation
The Flood
Samson
The Burning Bush
David and Goliath
The Fiery Furnace
Daniel and the Lion's Den

For many of us, these stories shaped our faith, how we live, and remind us of the many different attributes of God. But I have noticed the stories we learned in Sunday School very seldom come up or are taught again in "big people" church. So for those of us who know these stories by heart, come with a childlike imagination to re-hear and learn the stories so fundamental to our faith. For those of us new in our faith, come with a childlike innocence as we go on an adventure with many of the great heroes of the Bible.

It is my prayer, as we journey through these Sunday School stories, we all, no matter our age, will be able to identify how we are part of the story. When Jesus invites us to "follow him", he's inviting us to join him in his story!

To help us follow Jesus and these stories, several of our elders and staff will have the opportunity to teach and preach this summer. This opportunity will give us a chance to hear how God speaks to and through other leaders in the church.

Also, as we move into summer, it is my hope that we as a congregation will have the opportunity to share our stories with one another and build unity. To do this, I (along with the LvCC staff and elders) want to invite you to join us for a time of fellowship. This time of fellowship will be during the end of the service, not after the service. Since it has been over a year for many of us to sit and chat with one another, we believe it is important to fellowship. According to Acts 2:42, fellowship was an important part of the gathering of believers (aka church service).

We are planning on meeting out under the tent at tables with coffee and some type of snack, if guidelines allow. At each table at least one member of church leadership (staff and elders) will be there to "host" the discussion. Ms. Mary is planning on having a separate table for children.

Let's be a "welcoming family" who can share how Christ has "transformed" us, so we can "express" his love to our neighbors!

I'm really excited for the summer of 2021! Will you come and join me, the elders, staff, and the rest of the LvCC family as we read the familiar Sunday School stories and gather around the table for fellowship? We miss you!!




Youth: "Plugged In"



LIBRARY NOTES

The featured book from our Church Library this month is a biography, *"A Severe Mercy"* by Sheldon Vanauken, as reviewed by Kay Busack



This fine book began with a growing, profound love between Sheldon and Jean ("Davy") Vanauken. Davy and Sheldon met in New York State before World War II. Sheldon was at Yale when they began to date and form their "Shining Barrier", the wall built in their relationship to protect their love. Together they fought against creeping separation.

They had a secret wedding followed by a formal wedding that was interrupted by the U.S. Navy ordering Sheldon to Pearl Harbor. After both serving at Pearl Harbor, they moved to Miami and lived aboard a boat in the Florida Keys. Sheldon returned to Yale for his MA and taught at a small Virginia College. During that time they had a schooner, the "Gray Goose" built for them.

The lifelong hope of attending Oxford became possible, so their life took an English residence. Surrounded by a host of Christian friends, they began to consider the Christian faith. Sheldon also began a correspondence with C.S. Lewis. As a result, the book is largely a collection of letters between the two. God eventually breached their Shining Barrier-Davy first, then Sheldon. After a glorious Oxford experience, including visits with C.S. Lewis, they returned to Virginia and Sheldon taught at Lynchburg College. Their lives were full now that they were in a full relationship with many locals.

You will enjoy this book. It is well written with many events well covered. A lovely story of a journey to choose to believe in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
