Elder Meeting Highlights

Sean Kelly opened the Elders meeting on July 19 with prayer and then shared a devotion about Jesus the Vine and the need for pruning of branches. He referenced John 15:1-5, Matthew 3:8 and 7:16-20 and talked about how pruning is necessary, although it sometimes feels like loss, and even when a branch is producing fruit, pruning causes more growth. He discussed how these principles apply to individuals and to the church. The Elders then spent time praying for each other and the congregation.

Church Treasurer Jaime Boaglio shared the financial reports from June and shared that YTD net income is about -\$14,000. This is partially due to several necessary expenses such as van maintenance and paying to bring in two candidates, but essentially it is because member contributions continue to be low and are \$16,000 less than projected.

Randy Sundberg gave an update on the steam condensate lines project and said most of the demo has been done in preparation for the work to begin in August, with the hope of being able to use the boiler by October. He mentioned that a few other projects will be deferred until next year due to the current deficit in the budget.

Patrick Allen reported that, after the recent hiring of Caleb Strom as Discipleship and Community Life Pastor, the Personnel Committee will be shifting their focus to several other areas including working on the details of FMLA for Garrett and Sarah Fix, Lead Pastor review, format of staff reviews, revisiting the employee hand-book, standardization of staff job descriptions and contracts, the annual insurance review, and projecting budget needs for 2023.

Dave reminded the Elders of the discussion last month about forming a Stewardship team and suggested they continue to move ahead, especially considering the current state of our finances. He suggested having an Elder representative on the team but also include other church members. Sarah Rundell remarked that the current state of world finance might actually aid in people's receptiveness to the idea of and need for good stewardship. Dave asked the Elders to be in prayer for names of people who could help lead this.

Dave commented that there might be issues with current staff or lay van drivers not being able to drive church vehicles based on our current Transportation Policy. Sean commented the policy was based on our insurance company's recommendations. The Elders felt strongly about maintaining the policy. Dave also mentioned that there are a few places on our property that are dangerous such as the bell tower, catwalk above the sanctuary and the crawlspace under the stage. Dave suggested that Patty contact our property insurance company for their recommendation regarding a policy limiting our liability.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m. The next Elders business meeting is scheduled for August 16 at 7 p.m. in the Journey Room.

FISH Report for July

FISH is fun ministry to local people in need of food. The only requirement to receive a full grocery cart of food is to call and come to the church to pick up the food. Every family receives fruit, vegetables, potatoes, peanut butter, jelly, canned meat or fish, milk, eggs, bread, ground beef, cereal, toothpaste, soup, chili, top ramen, mac & cheese, soap, toilet paper, and margarine. Many other items are available to choose from including cheese, dried beans, ketchup, mustard, canned foods, deli products, pet food, diapers, laundry detergent and feminine products.

In July, over 40 dedicated volunteers served 586 people including 267 children. Funding and food come from individual donations, LCC Missions Committee, FISH of Cowlitz County, CAP, and food banks.

Please save your clean paper, plastic, and canvas bags and non-perishable food items for us. Donations can be put in the FISH boxes located throughout the church.

This ministry has an amazing dedicated crew of volunteers. Volunteer shift commitment can be as little as one 3 hour shift every two months. If you would like to join in the fun, please contact Lisa Som at 360-431-9686.

I hope you all have a blessed rest of your Summer!




WOMEN'S NEWS
